




Curriculum News

Our Term 6 topic is largely geography based and is entitled 'Oh I Do Like To Be Beside the Seaside'. The children will use maps to find seaside locations and use geographical vocabulary to describe these. They will compare seaside holidays of the past and present and will go on a very exciting trip aboard the Romney Hythe and Dymchurch Railway.


Our Science topic is 'animals including humans' where the children will find out more about different sea creatures.

Dolphins- Year 3 and 4

Our topic this term is 'Crime and Punishment', which will be focusing on how these have changed over a long period of time. This will include looking at a range of historical eras e.g. the Romans; Anglo-Saxons; The Tudors and Victorian prisons. Our science will be studying plants, looking at the parts of a plant, what they need to grow and survive and the life cycle of flowering plants. This will link with our English, Jack and the Beanstalk, which will include writing in a range of genres. Our art work will also be linked to science. Here we will be sketching plants and flowers. In PE our skills will be honed in athletics, with our upcoming Sports Day in mind.



Eagles- Year 5 and 6

Our topic this term is 'All the World's a Stage'. We have a lively and busy term ahead, preparing for our musical play, 'The Keymaster', which will be performed on 18th July. Much of our English will be relating to this play, but we will also be studying a unit on Shakespeare and learning some poetry by heart. In science, once we have completed our work on 'All Living things', we will be learning about the human circulatory system and looking at the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way the body functions. Our Year 6 pupils will all be involved in transition activities, in which we help to prepare them for secondary education and all the exciting changes ahead of them.
